Sundays remain satisfactory.


There is a serious difficulty in that six to seven months have passed without Mr. Murton showing any interest in the children. They are now fearful of Mr. Murton, and do not wish to go with him. Apparently, this is in part due to the altercation in the Spring wherein Mr. Murton threatened to shoot Mrs. Murton.

Mrs. Murton is prepared to co-operate in an effort to re-establish access, and it would seem apparent that some "re-establishing" is necessary. Therefore, I would propose that an informal-voluntary, supervised-access arrangement be commenced for the initial three-four week period. During this period, a neutral and trustworthy third party would have to be present during the visitation. The third party would have to be someone that both parties were comfortable with, and agreed upon.
